
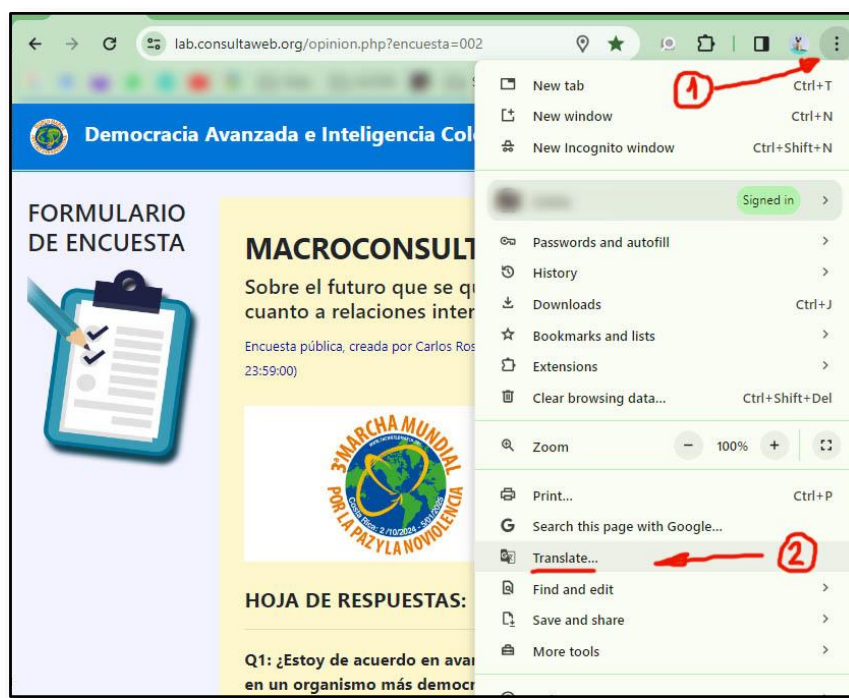


AUTOMATIC TRANSLATION OF WEB PAGES

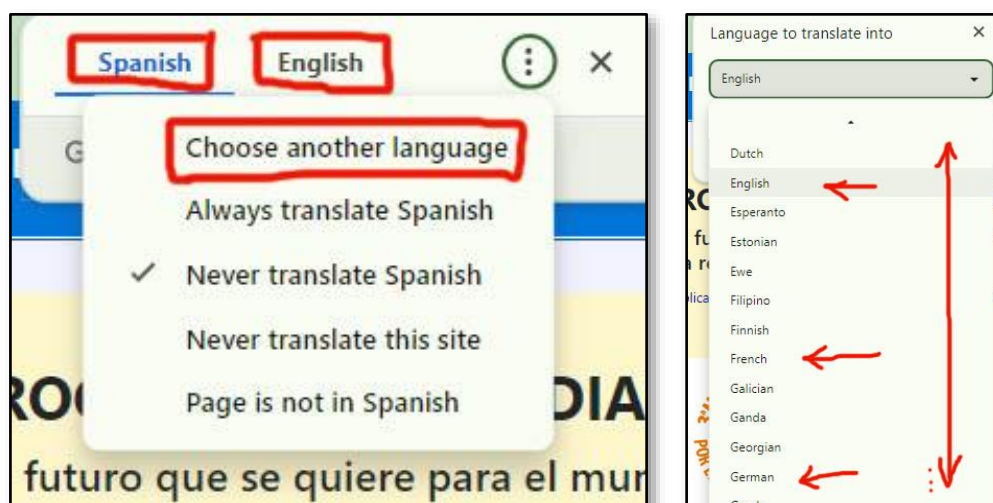
Nowadays it is not necessary to translate a website into many different languages on servers, as translators are becoming better and better, due to the advancement of AI. It is now possible to do this automatically from web browsers using the methods detailed here (for both desktop and mobile devices)

 **GOOGLE CHROME** (On all types of devices and operating systems)

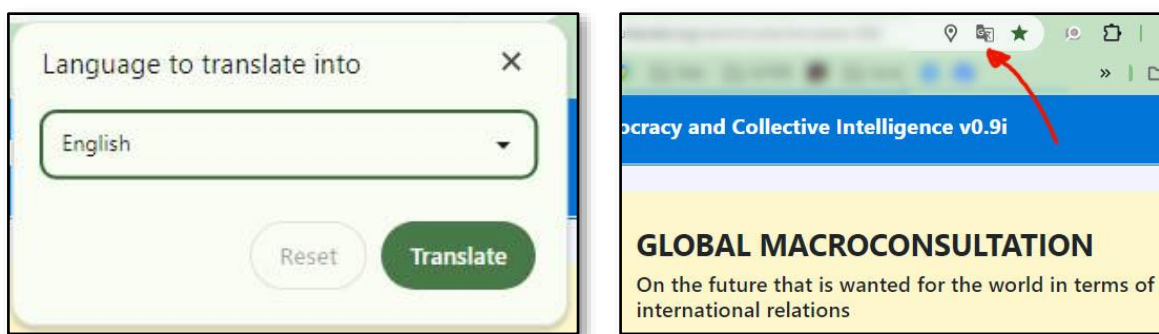
From the configuration button at the top right, click on the translate option:



This opens a dialog box with our language, a second language that we have used and in the points at the top right we can choose any other:




We choose our language from that list and then click on translate. We will then see the page in that new language and from now on we can see an icon in the translation bar to revert or change the language again:





The process is practically the same in web browsers for desktop PCs and tablets or smartphones (settings > translate > choose language > more languages >...) Of course, it is convenient that we have Chrome as the default browser in case we enter the website from a link that has been sent to us by email or WhatsApp.


SAFARI (On iPhone, iPad, and Mac desktop computers)

We go to the website that we want to translate. We press the Share  button. We look for the Translate option (Translator) and press it and choose language.

MICROSOFT EDGE (On Windows desktop computers)

the translate icon  in the address bar must be selected. This button appears to the left of the star (favorites) icon and is only visible if Edge thinks the current page is in a foreign language that we don't understand. (In configuration  > Languages we can choose which languages we understand and we must also enable the option "Ask if I want to translate web pages that are not written in a language I understand" (if we change the configuration we have to exit and re-enter Edge) Once the translate icon appears, we select the language we want and click on "Translate".

MOZILLA FIREFOX (On Windows and Linux desktop computers)

On the settings button  in the top right, we directly choose "Translate page", it detects the source language (Spanish) and we choose our desired language.
